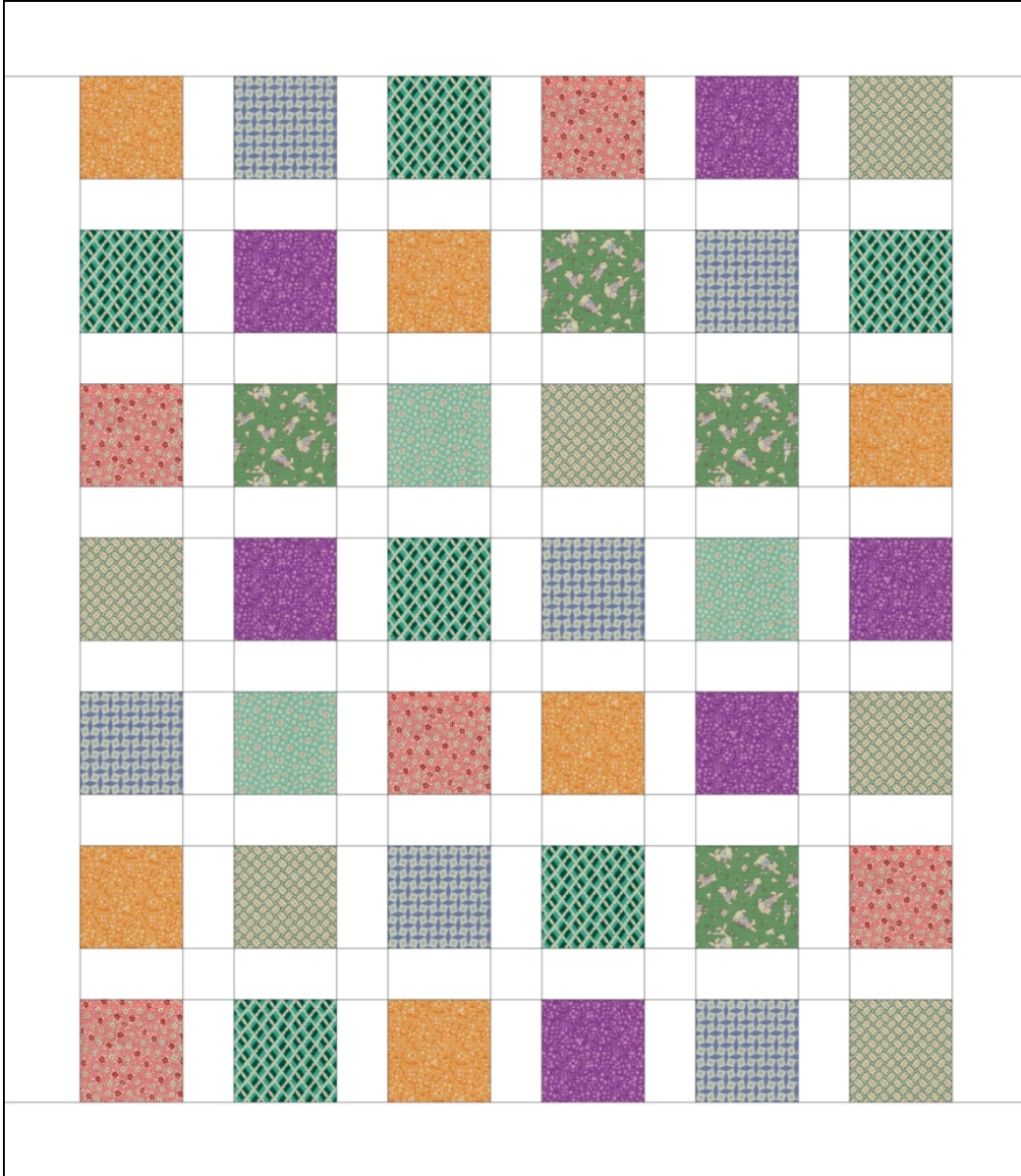


# Fast-n-Fun Fat Quarter Baby Quilt

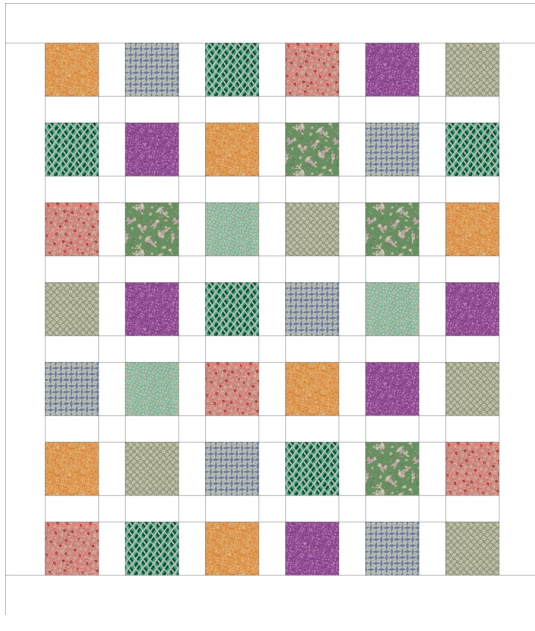
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## Fast'n'Fun Fat Quarter Baby Quilt



**Crib Quilt**  
**Block size: 4 1/2" (4" finished)**  
**Finished Size: 40" x 46"**

This pattern is very simple to create and is a great way to use some of those special fat quarters you have in your stash. This pattern is fantastic with 1930's reproduction fabrics!

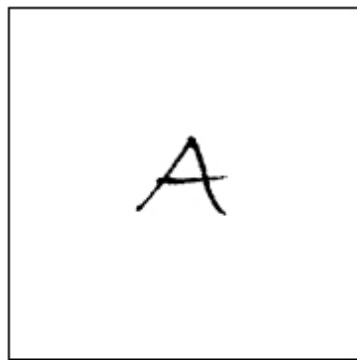
All seams should be sewn with a **scant 1/4" seam allowance**, and all seams should be pressed to one side. Press after every seam you sew to ensure your blocks are accurate.

### Materials and Yardage:

Yardage requirements based on 40" wide fabric.

Material:	Yardage:	Cutting Guide:
Various prints	At least 3 FQ, more for greater variety. OR 3/4 yard fabric.	42 A
White	1 3/8 yards	35 B, 6 strips 2 1/2" x 34 1/2", 4 strips 3 1/2" x 40 1/2"
Backing	1 1/2 yards (be sure your fabric is at least 44" wide)	
Batting	Crib (45" x 60")	
Binding	1/2 yard	

### Rotary Cutting Guide:

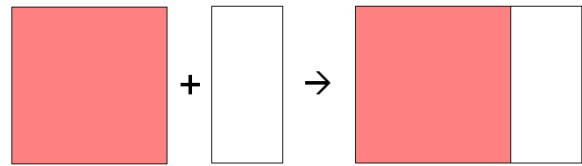

Measurements include a 1/4" seam allowance.

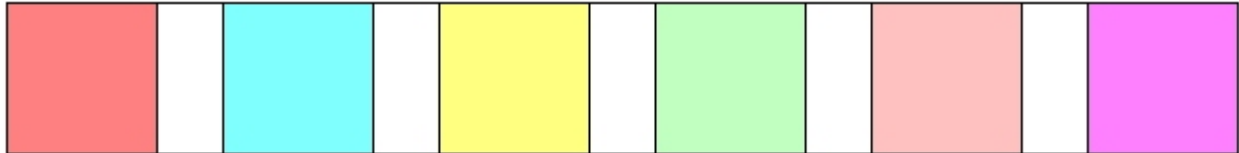
Note that this guide is only to provide a visual of what the pieces will look like once they are cut, they are not to be used as templates.

Assembly:

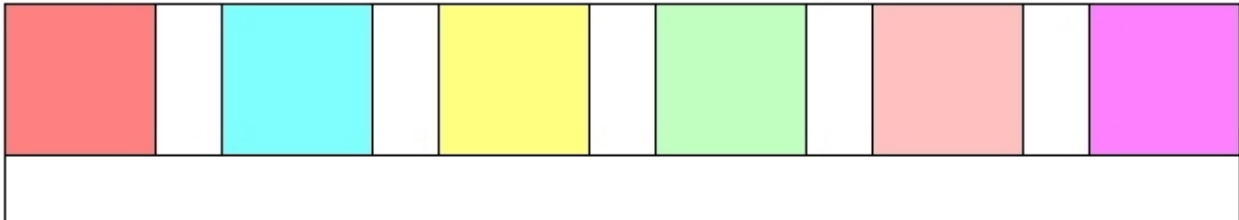
1) First, sew together a white “B” and a colored “A” to make a unit as pictured. **Make 35 units.** For greater variety, randomly select which “A” pieces you use for this step.



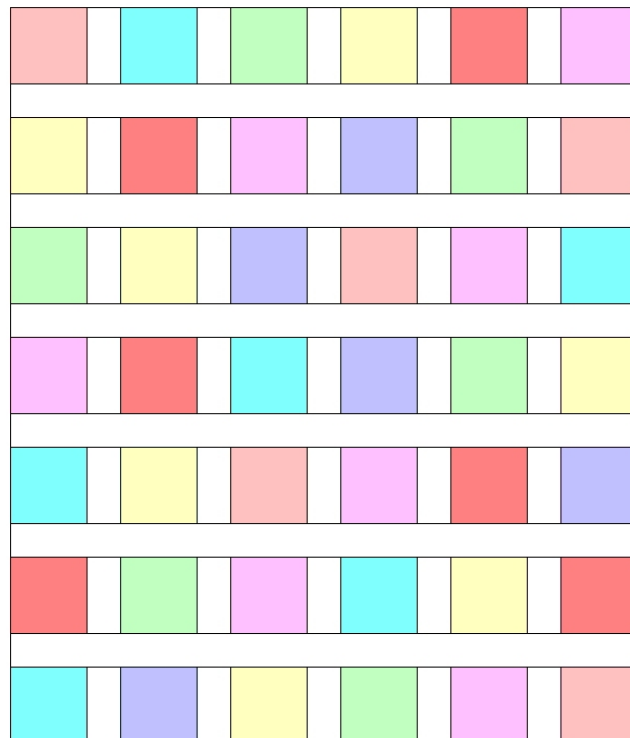
2) Assemble 7 rows made from 5 of the units made in step 1, plus an additional colored “A”.



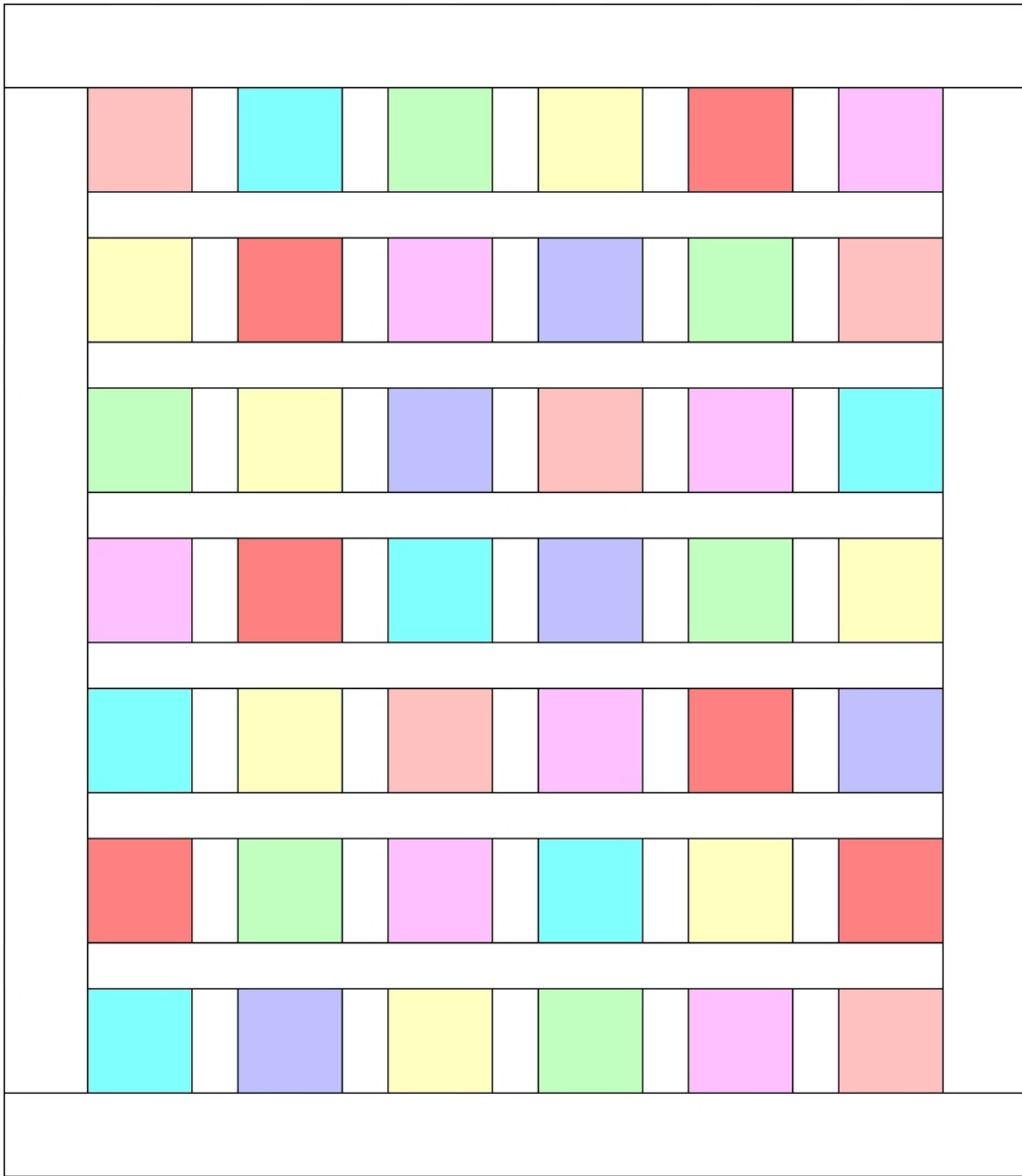
3) To the bottom of 6 of the rows made in step 2, sew one of the 2½” x 34½” white strips.



4) Assemble the quilt center. Sew the 6 rows from step 3 together, ending with the 7th row from step 2 that does not have a white strip sewn to it.



5) Add the borders. Sew the side borders on first, then the top and bottom borders.



6) Layer backing, batting and quilt top; baste; quilt as desired. Bind to finish.

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
